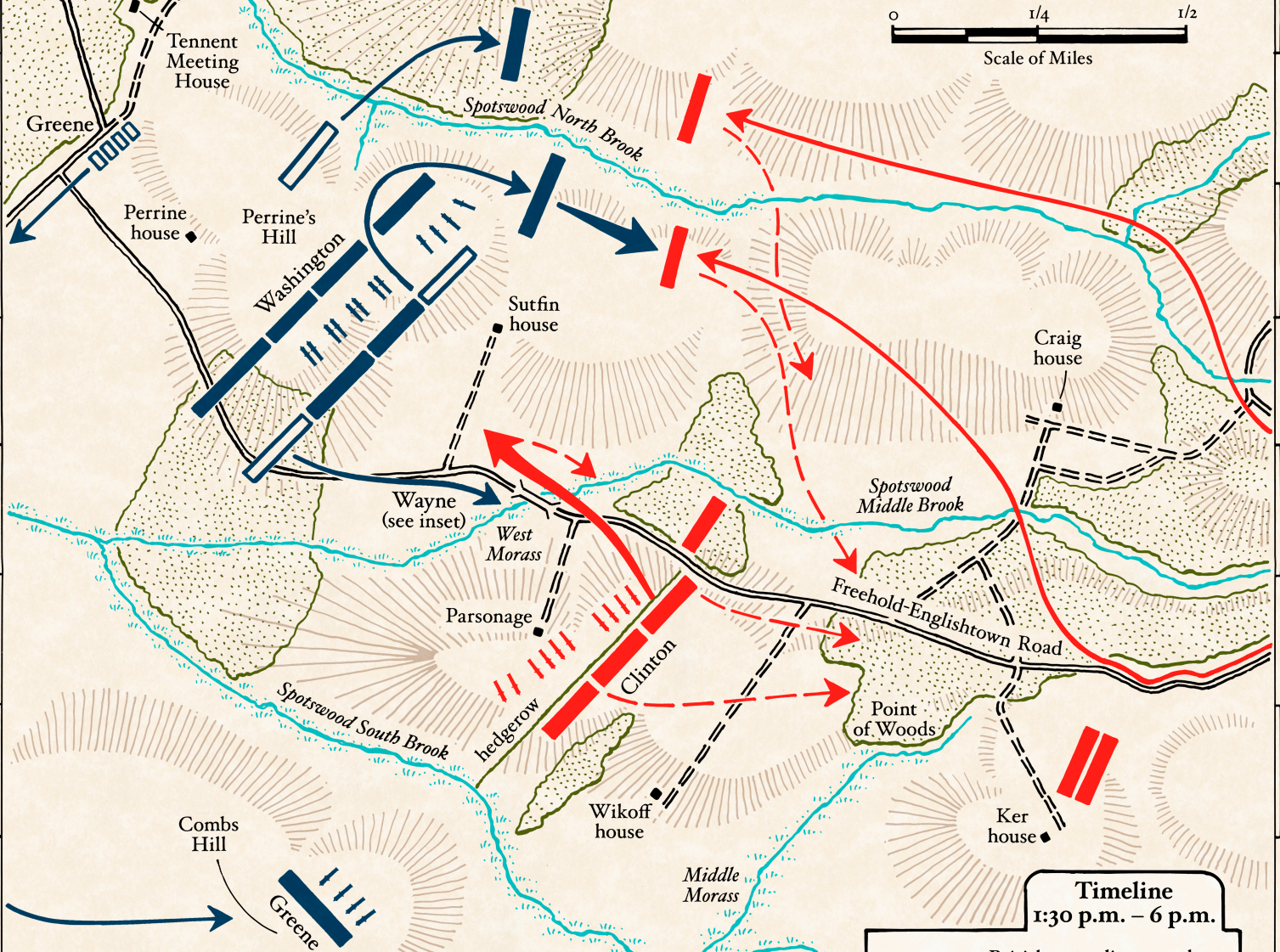


Battle of Monmouth

JUNE 28, 1778 – 1:30 P.M. to 6:00 P.M.

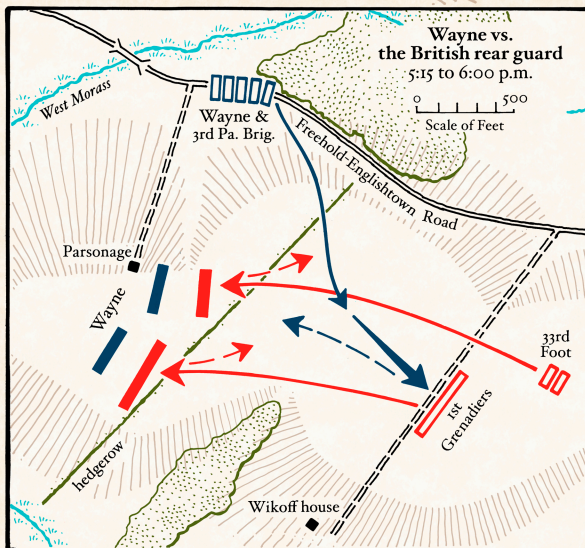

Timeline

1:30 p.m. – 6 p.m.

- 1:30 p.m. – British grenadiers attack across the bridge and are beaten back.
- 1:30-3:00 p.m. – British troops threaten the American left. George Washington (GW) counters by moving troops further left.
- 1:45-3:45 p.m. – “The Great Cannonade,” one of the war’s largest artillery duels, rages.
- 3:45 p.m. – After moving around the British left, Nathanael Greene’s artillery opens fire against their flank.
- 4:10-5:10 p.m. – GW orders an attack on the British right, and sends Anthony Wayne across the bridge to assault the British rear guard.
- 5:15-6:00 p.m. – Wayne attacks the 1st Grenadiers (see inset). Reinforced, the British counterattack pushing Wayne back. Greene’s artillery fire forces their retreat. The British army withdraws from the field and continues its march to Sandy Hook.
